### Teen in Court for House Crash

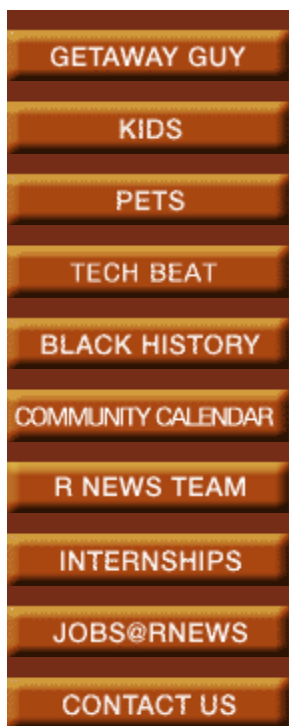
The Greece teen charged with DWI after crashing his car into a home last month was in court Monday.

A preliminary hearing was held for Brandon Volpe, 18, in Greece town court. Volpe is accused of driving drunk and crashing his car into an Old Edgemere Drive home on April 26. He also faces charges of speeding and reckless driving.

The wreck damaged the home of Clint Walker and Angela General so badly that the town of Greece had to demolish the house.
